
I will be watching my mailbox until May 19 for the pictures, letters, and other tid-bits that you are sending.

# Student wants to pave info highway

RISING CITY — Julee Dunekacke wanted to make sure the information made a stop in Rising City.

The Rising City High School senior landed an internship at Educational Service Unit 7 in Columbus, and part of her job involved making sure people knew about her school.

SHE WROTE home page titles for Rising City Public Schools. Dunekacke said home page titles give people a look at Rising Public Schools and what makes it different or unique.

The pages include a photo of the school and information about all the teachers, principal, superintendent, school and community. She created all the pages from scratch, she said.

"It took me a long time," she said. "I started working on this in December."

Dunekacke said the home pages are in the World-Wide Web, which can be accessed by people from all over the world. Rising City was the first K-12 school in Nebraska to be on the World-Wide Web, and the second school in the state, after Millard North High School.


SHE SAID Rising City is also the smallest school on the program nationally. Dunekacke was the first student to create the school home pages in the state. She said teachers helped set up the pages at Millard North.

"I really want to get this to all the schools," Dunekacke said. "My goal is to pave the information highway."

She said she is continually adding more information about the school. Dunekacke said she included school calendars and student achievements.

The hardest part of the project was deciding what information would be useful to other schools. She said she asked the teachers to provide details about their class and what they teach.

Dunekacke said she asked Superintendent Jon Habben to write a few paragraphs about the school

and to also include his educational background, committees and groups he is involved in and his electronic mail address.

**THE KEY** is not to give up, she said. If given time, Dunekacke said she can usually find a solution.

"Sometimes you want to shoot the computer, but you've got to stick with it," Dunekacke said.

Through ESU, she wrote a grant to allow her to teach other students how to make pages for their communities.

"High school students aren't afraid of it," Dunekacke said. "Some teachers you can't get in front of the computer."

Jeff Zimmerman, communication coordinator for ESU 7, said most of the work Dunekacke does is from a computer at Rising City and is sent to the service unit.

HE SAID Dunekacke also helps with presentations to schools on the Internet and World-Wide Web.

"She is a very driven woman," Zimmerman said. "She seems to enjoy what she is doing."

He said this is the first time the service unit has offered an internship to a student.

Prior to landing the internship with ESU, Dunekacke had an internship in 1993 with the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Nebraska Research Initiatives Center for Information and Communication Science.

LAST YEAR, she also served as an intern at Iowa State University. She said she found out about ESU because her mother was taking a class at the service unit, and she and her mother were communicating with each other over the computer.

She said she just asked ESU for an internship. Although she is not paid for her work, she does receive access to the Internet for an hour a day and will receive a grade.

In addition to the pages for the school, Dunekacke also created her own personal page about her likes and dislikes. She is only the fourth high school student in the state to accomplish this task.

Dunekacke said she first became interested in the Internet five or six years ago. The Women Investigating Science and the Environment selected her to be one of 45 people to participate in a Macintosh Computer camp.

SHE SAID she was given a computer, a modem and an 800 number to access the Internet. Dunekacke said the idea of the program was to give girls in rural communities access and knowledge about Internet.

Dunekacke said she plans to attend UNL and major in computer engineering. She said she wants to help improve smaller, rural schools' access to Internet.

Dunekacke said it is often hard for smaller schools to get on the Internet because of the cost and because their modems aren't fast enough.

# James Kresha To Boys State




The William Wolfe Post 91 of Osceola has announced that James M. Kresha will be their representative to Boys State this June. Alternate is Michael P. Neujahr.

Dear family,

I haven't had a letter in the past several Kronicles, but I have had quite a bit of correspondence with different family members about the issue of my coming out of the "closet" as a lesbian woman. Most of the reactions were "why did she have to tell us?" You see, without knowing this important part of my life, you don't know me. A large part of my life has been kept secret from you, and it has been a source of estrangement all of my life. Because we still live in a society that misunderstands or is fearful of gay people, it takes great courage (even at age 60) to identify myself completely to all of you. Everything in our culture's treatment of homosexuality says "don't ask, don't tell".

I came out of the closet to all of you to help you understand something about this subject. With the size of the Kresha family, I probably am not the only same gender oriented person in the extended family. I wanted you to know that gays are not **those people**... but we are sisters, aunts, etc.; people raised in families with you. Some of you were very disturbed about me "choosing to be a sinner" assuming that being homosexual is a matter of choice and that this was a conscious decision. In fact, gay people do not choose their sexual orientation...I simply am what I am: homosexuality is my true nature. The only choice I had was to be honest about who I am or to hide it. Hiding it imposed a tremendous burden...it meant living in part concealment, day in and day out, all my life.

For some family members the most difficult issue is, "how do I reconcile this with my religion?" It is true that some religions continue to condemn homosexuality. Even within these religions, however, there are respected leaders who believe that their church's position of condemnation is unconscionable. Many mainstream American religions have now taken official stands in supporting the civil rights of gay persons, and have developed networks of welcoming and reconciling parishes/congregations. I have belonged to the Catholic organization for gay persons, Dignity, for many years. You will still hear people quote the Bible in defense of their prejudice against gay people, but there are other biblical scholars who dispute any anti-gay interpretations of biblical texts. There are many resources now available for any one who would like to learn more about changing religious attitudes toward all human sexuality.

A mother of a lesbian woman said, "Most of us are like three leaf clovers...sort of ordinary, not much attention is given to us...but once in a while we find a four leaf clover...a rare and wonderful discovery. I remember that I would spend hours as a youngster looking for a four leaf clover. Once in awhile I would find one and press it in a book. It was something I treasured, wanted to save and protect.My lesbian daughter is like one of those four leaf clovers; her sexual orientation just happens to be different from mine. She is someone I treasure and want to protect. A four leaf clover is not unnatural, just unusual and different from the rest. I would have never considered removing one of the leaves so it would appear to be a three leaf clover."

Likewise, I hope to be treasured by some of you.



## Dunekacke Awarded Lutheran Brotherhood Scholarship


